

IDIOM OF THE DAY



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Meaning

To **get out of hand** means to become uncontrollable, chaotic, or unmanageable. It often implies that a situation started off fine but escalated beyond what was intended or expected.



Sample sentences:

1. The party started fun, but it quickly **got out of hand** when too many people showed up.
2. His spending habits have **gotten out of hand**, and now he's in debt.
3. The argument between the two friends **got out of hand** and turned into a fight.
4. Things can **get out of hand** if we don't set clear rules from the beginning.
5. The project **got out of hand** because no one was managing it properly.
6. Her excitement **got out of hand**, and she couldn't stop talking during the meeting.
